Shavuot

Three times a year all your men must appear before the Lord your God at the place he will choose: at the Festival of Unleavened Bread, the Festival of Weeks and the Festival of Tabernacles. No one should appear before the Lord emptyhanded: Each of you must bring a gift in proportion to the way the Lord your God has blessed you.

Deuteronomy 16.16-17

The 3 key Jewish Festivals

Where all Jewish men had to go to Jerusalem

- Feast of Unleavened Bread Passover –
 Pesach in the spring
- Feast of Weeks Shavuot in the early summer
- Feast of Tabernacles Sukkoth in the Autumn

Feast of Weeks - Shavuot

- 50 days after Passover (hence 'Pentecost')
- just after the harvest had been taken in
- each person should bring a gift to the Lord
- two loaves baked with yeast and animals for sacrifice



Feast of Weeks - Shavuot

- Reaches back to past redemption
- Thanks God for blessing in the here and now – above all it's about harvest
- Requires a heart response in giving away what you have received from the Lord
- Everyone is involved

When you reap the harvest of your land, do not reap to the very edges of your field or gather the gleanings of your harvest. Leave them for the poor and for the foreigner residing among you. I am the Lord your God.
