

Wider Context of Isaiah

- Chapters 1- 39 is addressed to people before the exile: Mostly to do with judgement, however mentions future hope in a messianic king (Isaiah 7:14, 9:6-7)
- Chapters 40-66 is addressed to people after the exile: Focuses on the new hope God's servant, the messiah



A metaphor based on the restoration process which the Jewish people experienced when they returned from exile.





Peter's impact on society



The Acts of Peter

- 1st Sermon 3000 people start believing in Jesus
- Leads the church in Jerusalem
- Pray for Samaritans to be filled with the Holy Spirit
- Healed the sick
- Raised the dead back to life
- Tells the gentiles (non-Jewish) about the good news of Jesus and they receive the Holy Spirit
- Arrested numerous times for preaching the good news of Jesus & and no longer conforming to Jewish traditions.
- 300 years later Constantine declares Christianity the religion of the Roman Empire.

What to do if you call yourself a Christian

- Prioritise spending time with God
- Keep on asking God to fill you with his Holy Spirit
- Tell people the good news about Jesus
- Be willing to challenge sinful behaviour within the Christian community
- Humble yourself if someone challenges your behaviour!

- Be willing to change
