- 5. Representatives on various committees; Churches Together (Rona Smallwood), Christian Aid (Davina Freedman), Communicare (Wendy Clark); Bible Society (Paul Bexon-Chair); Mission Aviation Fellowship (Roger Arnett). All have agreed to continue. Andrew thanked everyone already on the rota.
- Reports from Groups and others: Andrew directed members to the reports included in the AGM booklet. No comments or questions.
- 7. Report from the Vicar: In addition to his report in the AGM booklet, Andrew added the following and began by expressing his gratitude and feeling of privilege at being the vicar of All Saints. The five key aims for the church were to grow larger-younger-deeper-stronger and wider, with four key values; loving-learning-serving-together. Andrew then discussed each of these aims and highlighted what had been achieved whilst thanking those individuals and groups involved.

**Larger** - whichever way you look at it the numbers are very encouraging. Service numbers had increased in the last two years as follows

Year	Total all	No increase	% increase
2011	7158	632	9.7%
2012	8004	846	11.8%

The number of different people pass through our church on a Sunday was an average of 143. As regards Share in Prayer, comparing 2013 to 2012, 25 came off SIP and 39 went on. But of the 25 leavers 13 never attended, 7 attended occasionally and only 5 attended regularly. Of the 39 people we have gained, only 5 never attend (children, spouses of new members), 2 attend occasionally (they live away) and 32 attend regularly. So we have if you like lost 12 attenders but gained 34.

**Younger** – the average age of Swanage 48. In 2011 our average age was 60.4, in 2012 it was 58.25. In 2013 it had gone down to 51.7. This was not just B@9 because the average age of every service has declined in the last year. But B@9 had got off to an amazing start as a way of drawing people in. Warriors, Toddlers and the Youth Team were also doing a great job. Andrew also gave special thanks to Jess Haines for her contribution this year.

**Deeper -** in autumn last year 91 people completed the SHAPE course following which we have put together 10 ministry teams involving over 90 people one way that we get closer to the Lord is by prayer. The Prayer/Prophetic/Intercession/Healing team had held a brilliant prayer ministry training morning with Rob and Ann Richards and we had also set up a prophetic prayer group. The team leaders are covering immensely more ground than Andrew would ever be able to do as vicar. Andrew also thanked our musicians, service leaders, preachers and AV people.

Stronger – Andrew mentioned the Pastoral Care team involving 18 people plus the vicar now going through training from Ted as Team leader. Also home groups were now involving 10 more people than before. He also thanked the hospitality, events and welcome teams. Andrew mentioned Maureen and Ron Heath who had recently retired from Coffee Pot after many years service and a presentation was made.

Wider – there had been lots of activity in the Mission Action Team including a revitalised mission board, new links with the Kirk family in Chile and a link with Fernand in DRC. We also needed to look more intentionally at our local outreach which was the big challenge for us this year. One way to get the word out was through the Communications Team and Andrew thanked Mike Hayes and Andy Mutter for the brilliant website (andy was given a presentation to marked the church's appreciation). He also thanked the Buildings Team for all their hard work in making best use of our building. A special thank you was given to Harry Lodge for his work on the garden over many years and a gift presented.

The year ahead - Andrew mentioned the following

- a discipleship course for the whole church
- some training on outreach and evangelism
- reaching out to our community much more then ever before
- a teaching course on Romans but other things as well
- a church weekend perhaps in about February time
- looking forward to Matt and Vera joining us and taking the youth work forward
- more people going on short term mission trips
  - Finance was a big challenge, We need to be giving just over £7000 a month as a church but in the first 3 months of the year we gave slightly less than this time last year. The result is that we are heading for a loss of £25000 this year. We need to really seek God about this. Even if we take 100 people per Sunday this is only the equivalent of £16 per week or £70 per month. And we have more than 100 people coming every week.

Andrew concluded his comments by saying that the principal reason why people are joining All Saints is above all the fantastic people. Church life is sometimes a bit like a ride on a roller coaster with highs and lows (a lot more highs than lows) but a bit scary at times. But scary is fun and challenging. And you know where you're going because there's someone in charge - the Lord has it ultimately all under control - which is why being vicar of All Saints truly is the best job in the world!

8. Any other business: Ann Yeates promoted the APCM taking place the following day and suggested that being part of the Team meant supporting the other churches and working together. She also stated that as Nick Viney was standing down as Treasurer, attending the APCM was an opportunity to thank him for 15 years of dedicated service!

The meeting closed with prayer and the Grace.

- Started an entirely new service in Breakfast@9

- Continued to pray daily at Morning Prayer, weekly and monthly as the Prophetic Prayer Group and at the Hour of Prayer on Saturdays
- Watched Coffee Pot and Toddlers flourish and grow and welcomed the Diddi Disco on Friday afternoons
- Continued to support *Purbeck Evening Praise* and *Connect* enthusiastically
- Seen God once again amazingly provide for us and have given away 10% of our income to mission showing that the Lord's promise in Malachi 3.10 is true
- Attracted lots of visitors particularly through our absolutely brilliant website
- Continued loving our community by involvement in local groups (Communicare, Besom, the Depression Group, the Old Stable, the CAB, the Swanage Church Family, Christian Aid among others) and through Toddlers and Coffee Pot
- Started 'Just Walk Across the Room' and planned outreach events in the form of the *Community Carwash and Café* and the *Family Funday*.

# **Churchwarden's Report**

The on-going refurbishment of the church building saw a new plinth built to raise the PA/AV desk for improved operation - and new church speakers were also installed. The outstanding issue of a rusted anchor to a post-tensioned beam above the organ, discovered at the quinquennial inspection last year, has now been successfully renovated. A new loop system was installed in the church hall and a new amplifier for the church loop system purchased. The hall continues to be used for a wide variety of church events and by many community organisations – which also provides a significant income stream for the church.

A large wooden back-lit cross was erected on the east wall in memory of Jo Pratt; discreet coloured lighting behind the communion table and new glass entrance doors have all greatly enhanced the appearance of the building. New church lighting continues to be under investigation and late in the year, work commenced on the internal re-decoration of the church building. Our thanks as ever go to the building team for all they do in the maintenance of the church property.

Sadly we sustained an opportunistic theft of various items of PA/AV equipment which were covered by insurance and were in fact later recovered. This prompted us to put in place new security procedures within the building.

A faculty was obtained for the purchase and installation of a portacabin in the grounds of the church, to provide much needed additional storage for tables, equipment and youth facilities. Landscaping and screening work will take place once the portacabin is on site next year. The flower and vegetable plot operated by Fresh Prospects in the church grounds has been enlarged and continues to provide a therapeutic project for ill and vulnerable people.

Our locally well respected Toddler Group goes from strength to strength; and in the summer we welcomed our new Youth Worker, Matt Hurley and his new wife Vera. We are already seeing the benefits of his involvement both at All Saints' and in the youth work in the town. Breakfast @ 9 continues to develop and the variety of meetings, following the introduction of Tea @ 4, means an even wider range of services and ministry are now provided. Sermons and teaching are also available on our web-site and a number of visitors have attended All Saints' having found us via the web.

Our finances were again tested this year, but the exceptional generosity of All Saints' folk meant that our giving target and missions tithe were more than met by the end of the year.

The new ministry teams are now functioning and we are hugely grateful to the many members and clergy who are involved in so many varied aspects of ministry within the fellowship of All Saints' and that make it such a welcoming and active church. To our deputy wardens, a special thank you - and as ever, to our vicar Andrew, for his enthusiastic leadership and ministry. We look forward in anticipation to a special 2014 as God works in and through His people at All Saints' that we might indeed be a blessing to our local community.

# **Pastoral Team**

2013 was the first year in which the enlarged Pastoral Team has operated.

### **Pastoral Carers**

Over twenty church members or couples are Pastoral Carers who keep a look out for up to seven other church members or couples, and enquire to see if they are all right, if they do not come as often as usual to whichever service they usually attend. Most of these Pastoral Carers have agreed to visit those on their list if necessary.

Carole Puckridge now arranges new Pastoral Carers when necessary. The next annual meeting for Pastoral Carers will be held shortly.

### **Church Visitors**

There are eleven Church Visitors, four of whom are Lay Pastoral Assistants.

Most of the Visitors have one or more people whom they regularly visit, who are too old or infirm to come to church.. Some have visited the bereaved, which may or may not become a regular visit, according to need.

Five training evenings have been held - on the subjects of visiting (how to and how not to!), visiting the dying, sharing your faith when visiting, visiting the depressed and those mentally ill, and healing.

# **Prayer & Prophetic**

At the outset, we sought to build upon the existing prayer life at All Saints, which has always been at the heart of this church. It was important for us to spend time together, asking God to unfold his plan and timescale rather than impose our own.

Prayer Ministry - The first thing we did was to run a Prayer Ministry Training morning, open to everyone in the Church. Rob & Anna Richards together with Pru and Richard Bedwell led the morning, which was very special to many, not just for those on the prayer ministry team. It encouraged everyone and gave confidence to those who were nervous about praying with other people. Personal ministry was offered, and received.

Following this teaching session, "Guidelines for Prayer Ministry" was produced, a copy of which is in the Quiet Room. Prayer ministry is offered every Sunday, and we also respond to requests for prayer ministry during the week.

Prophetic - We meet about every six weeks, when we spend time in worship and then silence, just waiting on The Lord. In between these meetings a smaller group meets to pray through some of the words, pictures, scriptures received. Andrew is an integral part of this ministry. A prophetic prayer group meets every Thursday at midday in the Church.

Prodigals - We met three times over six weeks to pray for our adult children who are away from the Lord, speaking out the promises from scripture over our children, to bless them and to encourage faith in ourselves, which can be hard to maintain after praying, often for many years. There are signs that some of our offspring are now in a better relationship with us and that God is ordering lives in ways that we have not seen before. We plan to meet again on an occasional basis to pray, hear news, and encourage one another.

We are so blessed by everyone who joins us in this ministry, and would like to thank everyone for standing with us.

### **Mission Action Team**

All Saints has continued its commitment to the worldwide church. We have maintained a mission focus each month, with reports, displays and prayer; we have received speakers from Marriage Week International, Sharing of Ministries Abroad, Anglican Refugee Network (Catherine Graham) and Kunde (Ray Pinneger). We have established a new personal link with Daniel & Elleina Kirk and their family, CMS Mission Partners in Valparaiso, Chile. Overseas visits have been made by Jess Haines (Tatarstan) and Lindy Cameron (Kenya & Pakistan).

From our General Fund giving we have allocated £87017 (10%) to outward giving, in addition to substantial sums raised through individual fund-raising events. Details of this will be available shortly. Many church members are committed to local ecumenical mission including Besom, Communicare, Impact and the Christian Centre. We hope to be actively involved in the new Christians Against Poverty initiative and actions arising from the Churches Together Community Audit.

# **Hospitality Report**

It has been a very good year with lots of events from 80<sup>th</sup> Birthday Party's to Harvest Supper, Live Nativity, Matt and Vera's Wedding, and a host of other events some of which were fund raisers for our new dishwasher and to date we have raised £2040.

I would like to think that the PCC could help us out with the next £1360. The Dishwasher is used almost every day by most people that use the kitchen.

The new machine that we have sourced only takes 7 minutes.

### So where are the children and young people at All Saints?

Firstly, at Toddlers on Thursdays at 1.30.

I am afraid I have never attended Toddlers, which is remiss of me and something I must remedy. Please see separate report for this group.

<u>Breakfast @9. Sundays.</u> This has the largest number of children and young people of all All Saint's activities. Of the regular attendees there are;-

10 Pre schoolers

5 Junior schoolers

8 Teenagers

3 pupils from Purbeck View School

TOTAL 26 children and young people.

Added to this, during the school holidays, there are grandchildren of church members plus other visitors.

Breakfast @ 9 report will give you further details, but for me I see this group as filling a great need for families to access church together, in an informal format.

Warriors during 10.30 service on Sundays.

There are just 2 regular attendees to this group with a very loyal and committed band of leaders. During school holidays there are often extra children who attend the service with their parents. The leaders cope

with the fluctuating numbers very well and often prepare sessions which are not used as no children attend on that week.

The craft table at the back of church for children to access during the first part of the service has been a great success and this has led into flag waving during the worship time.

### Joint Church Children and Youth Groups

Tetra. Friday evenings at the Methodist Church for ages 8 -11 years

2 of our children have attended this group, which is led by Tom Bullock and assisted by Matt Hurley. Jess Haines, Jo Dimarco are regular helpers with others from All Saint's also part of the team. Tuck shop, games, activities and a Bible slot are all included in these evenings

Juice. Tuesday evenings at All Saint's Hall. For ages 12 - 14 years

This group is led by Matt in his role as Parish Youth Worker and assisted by Tom Bullock, Vera Hurley and Jess Haines. Matt has a team of Volunteers from All Saints who are essential for the smooth running of these evenings.

Young people in this group are contacts from All Saint's, St Mary's, The Methodist Church and Swanage School. These evenings have Youth Club activities and games and include a 'God slot'

Refresh. Monday evenings at Tower Room and 15, Cluny Cres. Ages 14 -16 (at present).

This group is led by Matt and Vera Hurley with my assistance as host. We have 4 regular young people to this group. Three from All Saint's families and one who is an

occasional visitor to All Saint's. These evenings are informal and include activities, games and Bible verse discussion.

TOTAL 30 Children and Young People from All Saints who attend either the Church activities or the Joint church groups. (Some attend more than one)

#### CHURCH WEEKEND AWAY.

This very successful weekend was a bonus for our children and young people. Seven attended this time away, with some activities for all of them together and the teaching/discussion element split into two groups.

Matt and Vera organized the young people group times, while the Warriors leaders shared the children's.

#### THE FUTURE

Our children's and youth workers are passionate about seeing our young people get to know Jesus and grow into His Disciples. It would be so good to build them into a growing, supported and supportive group. In order to do this we need to find a way of bringing them together for teaching, discussion, fun, activities and prayer. This is being considered at the moment with possible changes being made to our existing format of services and activities.

- *Carol Service* this drew in over 200 people and again we were able to present the Gospel as well as enjoying carols and readings
- **Open Air Carol Service** a great *Churches Together* event where members of All Saints and Emmanuel presented the Christmas message to pa good crowd of people and some bemused passers by

- in September the Harvest Supper with a guest speaker
- in December a larger open carol air service on the theme of 'Silent Night' to commemorate when the troops in the trenches sang Silent Night to each other in December 1914
