Why so Important?

A double-sided snapshot of earliest Christianity

- 1. The writers' understanding of Gospel essentials
- 2. What it was like to be an early Christian

- The Letters mainly pre-date the Four Gospels
- ➤ The bedrock of Christianity

The Letters in the NT context

- 21 of 27 NT documents are "Letters"
- 13 of those 21 attributed to Paul
- Letters are 37% of NT in length
- Paul's writings a quarter of the entire NT; but 70% of all the Letters

Paul as Letter Writer (1)

- 1 & 2 Thessalonians . AD 50. "You turned......to serve a living and true God, and to wait for his Son from heaven...." I Thess. 1: 9-10.
- Galatians. AD 50-52? "For freedom Christ has set us free." Gal. 5:1
- 1 & 2 Corinthians. Mid 50s AD. "Faith, hope and love." 1 Cor. 13:13.
- Romans. AD 56-57. Justification by faith through grace.

Paul as Letter Writer (2)

The Captivity Letters

- Philemon. Mid/late 50s AD. Grace in action.
- Philippians. Mid 50s/Early 60s AD. (Depends on place of imprisonment).
 - "I thank my God every time I remember you." Phil. 1:3.
- Colossians. AD 57-61. The Cosmic Christ. "Christ in you, the hope of glory." Col. 1:2 7.
- Ephesians. Early 60s AD. "Head over everything for the church ...his body." Eph. 1:22-23.

Paul as Letter Writer (3)

The Pastoral Epistles AD 62-64?

- 1 & 2 Timothy
- Titus

☐ Instruction manuals for church leaders.

- The General or Catholic Letters
- Latter half of the first century.
- "Catholic" = applying to the universal church.
- > James. "Faith without deeds is dead." Jas. 2:26.
- ➤ 1 & 2 Peter. "Chosen by God." 1 Peter 1:2
- > 1, 2 & 3 John. Light, eternal life, love. "We should love one another." 1 John 3:11.
- ➤ Jude. "Build yourselves up in your most holy faith" v.21.
- ➤ Hebrews. Once for all sacrifice of Jesus. "Tempted in every way yet without sin." Heb. 4:15.

How to read the NT Letters?

Key Questions. What do YOU think about?......

- Why written?
- Writer's attitude to his readers, and theirs to him?
- Writer's points, arguments and themes?
- Recipients? Their problems and challenges?
- The clues are all there! Look for them for yourself

Relevance and Application

- Scripture's aim To hear God speaking to/challenging us in our own times.
- A. When we share similar life situations/issues with the first century world God's Word to us today is the same. Heed it/act upon it!
- B. When our situation and the original recipients of the Letters differ
 Identify and apply the principles behind what is being said.
