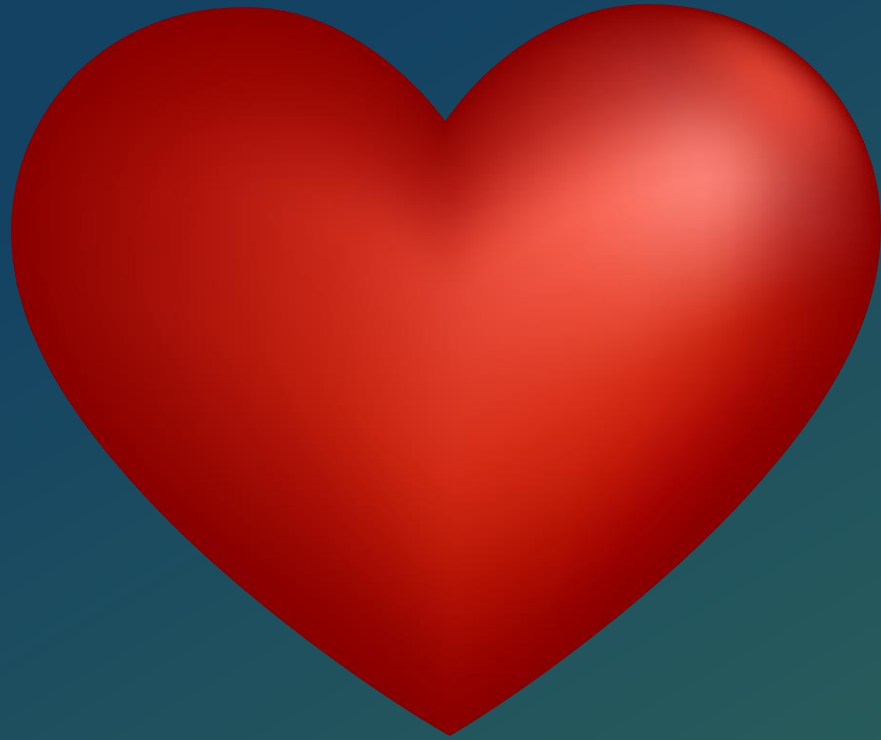




# THE 10 COMMANDMENTS

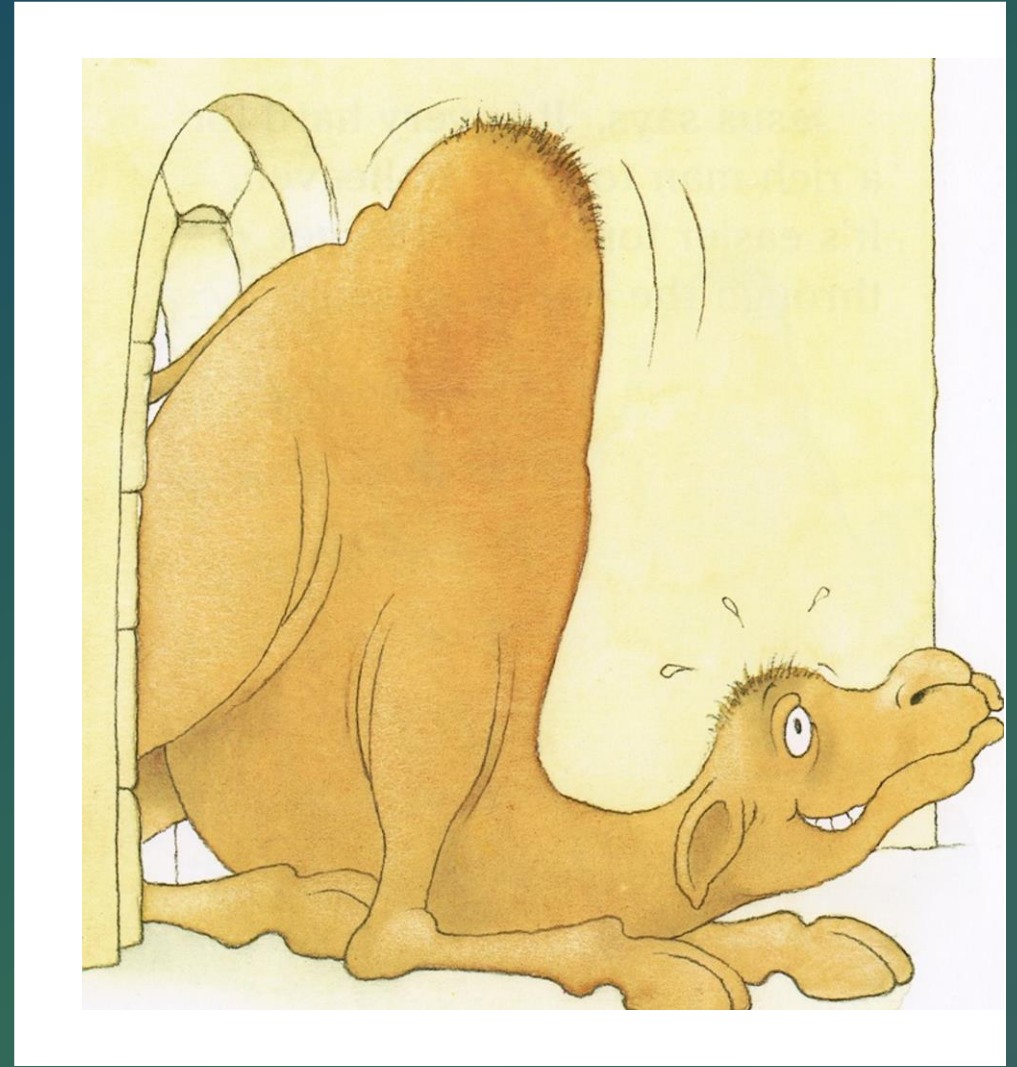
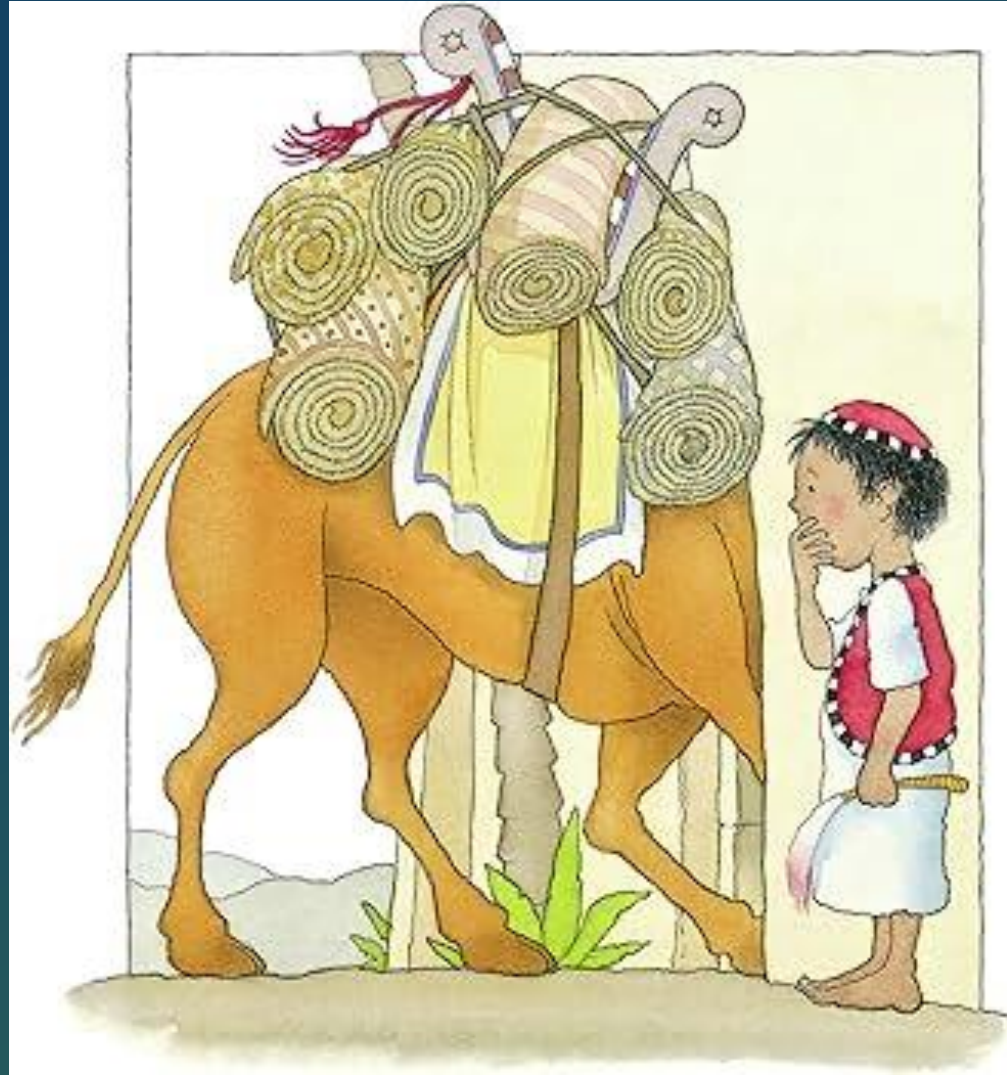

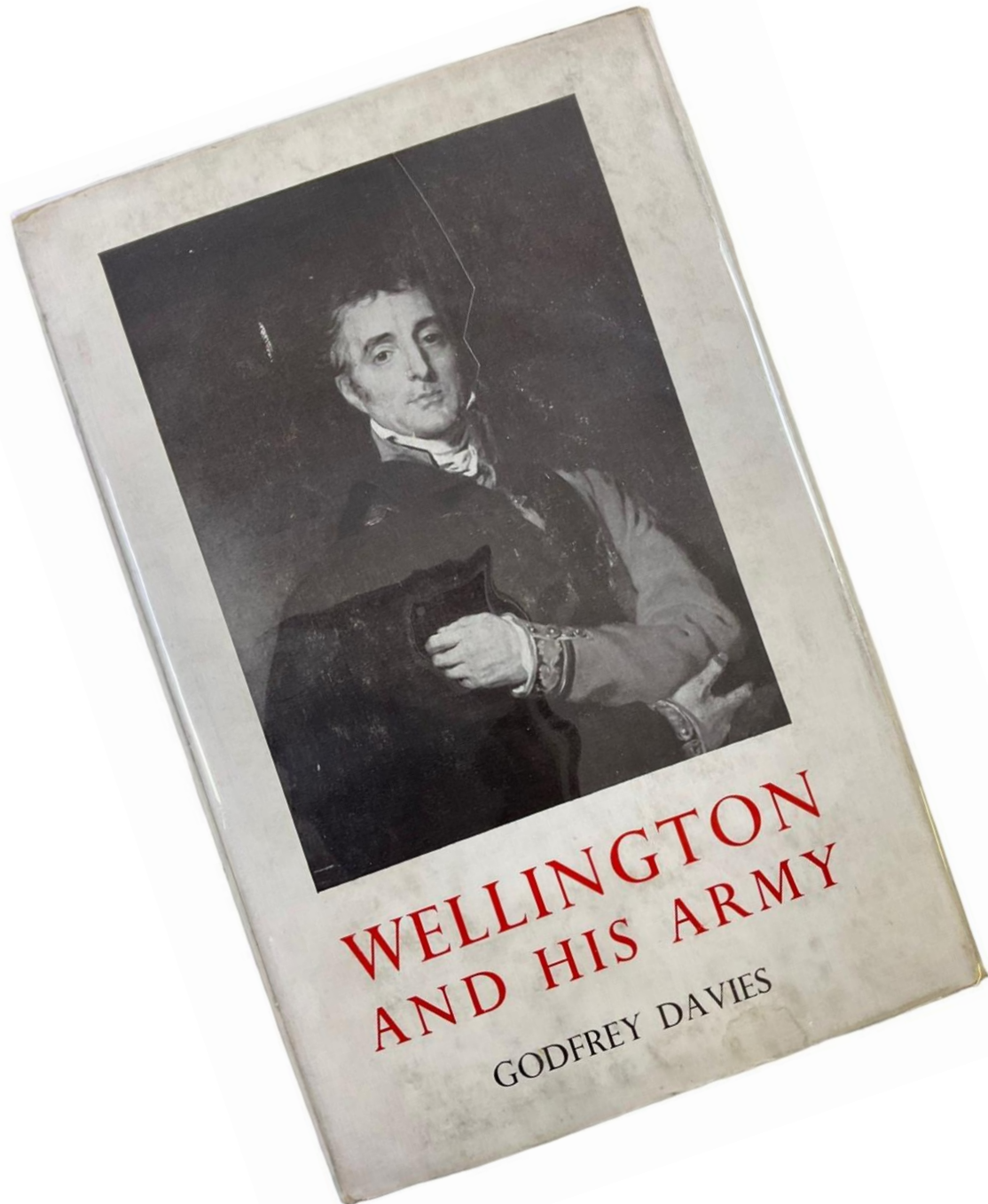
