### Book 20, Chapter 9

"But this younger Ananus, who, as we told you already, took the high priesthood, was a bold man in his temper, and very insolent. . . . He assembled the Sanhedrin of judges, and brought before them the brother of Jesus the so-called Messiah-Christ, whose name was James, and some others. When he had formed an accusation against them as breakers of the law, he delivered them over to be stoned."


"Now there was about this time Jesus, a wise man. For he was a doer of startling deeds, a teacher of such men as receive the truth with pleasure. And he gained a following both among many Jews and many of Greek origin. And when Pilate, at the suggestion of the principal men amongst us, condemned him to the cross, those that loved him at the first did not forsake him. 
#### **PAPIAS**



Lived 60-130AD

Recorded conversations with early disciples

Known as the "hearer of the Apostle John"



Wrote 5 books which have been lost but fragments are preserved through Eusibius and Irenaeus of Lyons

~90 years


#### **IGNATIUS OF ANTIOCH**



Lived 50+/- to 130s+/-

Student of the Apostle John

Wrote 7 letters



Ignatius was thown to the lions because of his faith - Eusebius + Jerome

#### **CLEMENT**



An Elder of churches in Rome


Wrote a letter in 90sAD to the Corinthian Church

- Records the martyrdom of Paul
- References to the martyrdom of Peter
- One of the earliest Christian documents outside of the New Testament

# 1,000,000 quotes from the Church Fathers





100-800 AD

"In comparison with the average ancient Greek author, the New Testament copies are well over a thousand times more plentiful. If the averagesized manuscript were two and one-half inches thick, all the copies of the works of an average Greek author would stack up four feet high, while the copies of the New Testament would stack up to over a mile high! This is indeed an embarrassment of riches."

**CONTROLLED** 

#### **Free Transmission**

 Benefit: Allows no single authority to edit its text

Cost: Variation between manuscripts

#### **Controlled Transmission**

 Benefit: Little variation between manuscripts

Cost: Vulnerable to agenda



# 400,000 Textual Variants?

That's 3 mistakes per word! How on earth can we trust the NT?

# What is a textual variant?

#### Any difference between manuscripts

### **Including:**

- Added words
- Missing words
- Misspelling



# 75% Misspellings

- 15% Grammar mistakes that cannot even be translated
- 9% Small variants from late manuscripts
- 1% meaningful variants 1 variation per 3 pages
