Why is 1 Corinthians Chapter 15 relevant?

Rabbinic terms for traditions passed on

"Paul wrote to the Corinthians from Ephesus in the early 50s C.E. But he says in 1 Corinthians 15:3 that "I handed on to you as of first importance which I in turn received." The most likely source and time for his reception of that tradition would have been Jerusalem in the early 30s when, according to Galatians 1:18, he "went up to Jerusalem to visit Cephas [Peter] and stayed with him fifteen days"





We may add here a short list of equally secure facts about the aftermath of Jesus' life:

his disciples at first fled;

they saw him (in what sense is not certain) after his death; as a consequence, they believed that he would return to found the kingdom;

they formed a community to await his return and sought to win others to faith in him as God's Messiah.

Did Jesus survive the cross and appear as though he rose from the dead?






SWOON THEORY



Components

- Braided leather thongs
- Metal balls
- Sharp pieces of bone

Injuries

- Bruises
- Deep cuts
- Ribbons of flesh coming off
- Back laid bare
- Blood loss



The crucifixion

- Pressure on chest
- Feet pushed on nails to breath
- Slow death
- Death from asphyxiation



"A person of that kind of pathetic condition would never have inspired his disciples to go out and proclaim that he's the Lord of life who had triumphed over the grave... After suffering that horrible abuse, with all the catastrophic blood loss and trauma, he would have looked so pitiful that the disciples would never have hailed him as a victorious conqueror of death; they would have felt sorry for him and tried to nurse him back to health"




Did the disciples steal Jesus' body?







Embarrassment #1 - An Apostle betrays Jesus




Embarrassment #2 - The disciples abandon Jesus



Did the disciples of Jesus hallucinate Jesus speaking with them?




Grief hallucinations are very common! They sense or hear the deceased person with them. Clearly Jesus' disciples had a hallucination of him



"I have surveyed the professional literature (peer-reviewed journal articles and books) written by psychologists, psychiatrists, and other relevant healthcare professionals during the past two decades and have yet to find a single documented case of a group hallucination, that is, an event for which more than one person purportedly shared in a visual or other sensory perception where there was clearly no external referent."
